RE: Emeritus Status – Kim Miller


Kim Miller has had a distinguished career at the university, beginning as a temporary instructor in 1985 and advancing through the ranks to become a Clinical Associate Professor in 2023. She earned her MS from Northwest Missouri State University in 1985, achieved tenure in 1991, and has made significant contributions to the field of special education.

As a Special Education teacher at Malcolm Price Laboratory School, she excelled as an Elementary Resource Instructor and Support Services Coordinator. Kim has presented widely at national and international conferences, focusing on special education and co-teaching models, and has led professional development sessions across various school districts and at the UNI campus.

Her scholarship includes numerous publications and grant projects, reflecting her commitment to advancing the field. Kim has received several honors, including the Gold Star Award (2000) and the President's Award from the Iowa Learning Disabilities Association (2009), and she was nominated for the Regents Award for Faculty Excellence (2019).

In addition to her teaching and research, Kim has served on multiple university committees and has mentored countless pre-service educators during their field experiences. Her extensive contributions to the profession, the community, and the university over her 40-year tenure at UNI make her an exemplary candidate for emeritus status.
