

September 6, 2022 Memo to UNI Faculty Senate

Dear Senators,

Curriculum proposals that require Board of Regents approval, such as program name changes and terminations, are handled before all other curriculum proposals in the annual curriculum cycle. This year the UCC and the GCCC both met during the first week of classes (August 22) to begin our curriculum reviews. The changes must be approved by the Faculty Senate before they can be moved to the BOR. Because the proposals have to be considered at three different meetings in the BOR process, we have to start right away in the Fall to make the schedule for the 2023-2024 catalog.

To facilitate your review of these proposals before the September 26, Senate meeting, you are receiving the following documents:

1. A document summarizing both Graduate and Undergraduate curriculum proposals.
2. Minutes from the UCC (Undergraduate Curriculum Committee) meeting (8-24-22) and the GCCC (Graduate College Curriculum Committee) meeting (8-26-22) in which these curriculum proposals were discussed.

You may review the actual curriculum proposals yourselves in the Leepfrog system. See below for instructions on how to access them.

How to look up these proposed programs in the Leepfrog system:

To find programs go to: <https://nextcatalog.uni.edu/programadmin/>

For example: For the ENVRESMGMT-BA, you can type *BA and that will bring you to a list of all the BA programs, scroll down to the ENVRESMGMT-BA; after selection you will see the program and any associated documents that were uploaded with it (i.e. justifications, consults, etc.)

For the ENVSCI-BS, you can type *BS and that will bring you to a list of all the BS programs, scroll down to the ENVSCI-BS; after selection you will see the program and any associated documents that were uploaded with it (i.e. justifications, consults, etc.)

For Graduate Programs, you would type AT-MS* and SPANISH-MA* and follow the same procedure.
