Solutions for tabled Interactive Digital Studies programs

Senators,

Both the Languages & Literatures and Marketing departments agreed to solutions to bring the programs we tabled at the last senate meeting back down to 15 credit hours, so the difficulty raised in the UCC appears resolved.

The Marketing department agreed to waive the prerequisite for MKTG 3148 for all IDS students, as we proposed. The Languages & Literatures department, on the other hand, agreed to make one of the pre-requisites (ENGL 2770) for ENGL 4785 a required course, to eliminate the second prerequisite for all students, and to reduce electives to 6 credits, in order to limit the program to 15 credits. In addition, Languages & Literatures already had a curriculum proposal in the current cycle to make prerequisites for this program corequisites, so students will be able to take ENGL 2770 simultaneously with ENGL 4785. Messages documenting these agreements are attached, and have been added to the petition on the Senate web page. I believe these changes resolve the issues of hidden prerequisites, raised by the UCC, that resulted in our tabling these programs. Thus, I look forward to resolving these matters during our January 13 meeting.

Finally, I'd like to take this opportunity to express my appreciation for your participation in the Faculty Senate. It isn't a very high-paying job, but you volunteer your time and attention, nevertheless. I very much enjoy working with you, and hope you are able to enjoy a restorative holiday season.
