I am writing to support Eric Lange's application to Emeritus Faculty at the University of Northern Iowa.

Eric Lange has been an integral part of TheatreUNI for 29 years, including 20 years as department head. I have known Eric for only the past year, and I have stepped into his role as head of theatre. He has graciously stayed this semester to assist the transition, and also to design lights for *Dracula*, *A Feminist Revenge Fantasy*. Eric has been a wonderful guide and is incredibly knowledgeable about the department, the university, and the wider community. As artistic director of TheatreUNI, he led the theatre through challenging times that disproportionately affected the performing arts.
