- a. Service Most Recently Faculty Senate since 2012
 - i. Vice Chair, 2016
 - ii. Chair 2017
 - iii. Current Vice-Chair (and next Chair: Amy Petersen, Assoc Professor, Special Education
 - iv. Immediate Past-Chair (now Secretary: Gretchen Gould: Collection Strategist Librarian & Assoc Professor, Library
- b. Amy, Gretchen & I work as a team to manage FacSen Agenda & ensure smooth operation of meetings, etc
 - i. You'll find us (usually) Sunday mornings, 10AM, at SideCar Coffee... please join us.
- 2. Main Point to make: Faculty Senate is The Embodiment of 'FACULTY GOVERNANCE'
 - a. And is THE principal representative agency of the university faculty in their role on educational policy & curriculum.
 - i. The Faculty Constitution grants The Senate the duty to work with policy.....
 - 1. Formation, integration and coordination, consultation, and adjudication (bylaws section 5).
- 3. Faculty Constitution (approved by Board of Regents February 20, 1986), "The faculty has the right to be <u>adequately informed about, and to participate jointly</u> in determination of policy touching <u>all the phases</u> of the University's operations. The faculty <u>shall</u> play a <u>central</u> role in all decisions regarding educational <u>policy and</u> <u>curriculum</u>."

4. We're now early in FY18, but so far Senate has:

- a. Consulted on Faculty Handbook (May & ongoing...)
- b. Speeded (and made less tedious) Fac' Sen meetings by adopting a 'Consent Agenda'
- c. Consulted on a 'Civic Action Plan' for the, *Community Engagement*. Part of the Strategic Plan
- d. Consulted on Academic Freedom and Shared Governance Policy
- e. Reviewed & voted on numerous Faculty Emeritus Requests
- f. Reviewed & Voted on various Academic Programs Initiation, Suspension, Termination, Reorganization, Renaming, etc, ..before such program policies move on for Regents Level Committee Review.
- g. So this is important work.... Our work.
- 5. President Nook, Provost Wohlpart, Associate Provost-Dean Pease, Associate Provost Vallentine usually attend Fac Sen Meetings
 - a. Conversations are informative, useful and congenial.
 - b. We are trying to promote a congenial atmosphere and encourage discussions on the larger issues of Academics and Faculty Governance.

- 6. So, even if you know little about the above-mentioned processes, let me encourage you to participate, at least at the committee level, or at the Senate Level (3-year gig)...... why?
 - a. Because 'Faculty Governance' doesn't mean '*ignore it and all will work out just fine*'. Rarely the case...
 - b. Because the University's and The Regent's recent emphasis on 'Openness & Transparency' requires vigilance, participation, engagement...... By US.
 - c. Because when you part with YOUR Valuable Time, THAT VALUE Validates these WORKING activities and FURTHER validates the concept of 'FACULTY GOVERNANCE'
 - d. We have a natural expectation that OUR VALUABLE TIME be fairly compensated.... So:
- 7. I will close by re-emphasizing Becky's (Joe's?) points about the upcoming vote on Union RE-Certification:
 - a. Voting will be electronic or by phone ... Probably Oct 18th?
 - b. Please participate, EVEN if you are NOT a Union Member
 - c. You ARE still a member of the 'Bargaining Unit'
 - i. So a NON-VOTE = 'No' vote
 - ii. We need a MAJORITY (50% plus 1) to retain the legal certification of OUR Union.
 - d. A 'No' vote makes NO SENSE for YOU, because, honestly:
 - i. No one else, besides the UNION, HAS YOUR BACK!!!
