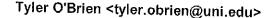

In 1994, Master's degree in hand, Dr. MacLin started his teaching career at Northwestern Nevada Community College. While pursuing his doctorate he was hired by the University of Nevada Reno to teach throughout his time there (this employment was separate and distinct from his assistantship). With his PhD, he was hired by the University of Texas at El Paso as an Adjunct Assistant Professor and Post-Doctoral Fellow. In 2001, he began his tenure track career at the University of Northern Iowa. He was promoted to Associate Professor and Tenured in 2006, and promoted early to Full Professor in 2010.

His career accomplishments include 43 peer reviewed articles (including 2 highly influential papers *Figural aftereffects in the perception of faces*, cited 334 times, and *Racial categorization of faces: The ambiguous race face effect*, cited 249 times), 3 book chapters, 5 books, 1 Amicus Curiae brief for the US Supreme Court, 9 instructors' manuals, 4 encyclopedia entries, 3 technical reports, 38 invited presentations, 263 conference presentations (most with students), and 14 software packages. He has chaired 13 MA theses, has 10 research citations in case law, been on CourtTV 3 times, and provided expert consultation in over 300 cases. He served as a regular reviewer for NSF, The British Academy, Social Sciences & Humanities Research Council of Canada, South Africa National Research Foundation, UK Economic and Social Research Council, and provided hundreds of reviews for journal articles. He served UNI in 38 university service positions, 18 CSBS service positions, 24 psychology department service positions, and taught 83 courses.

Dr. MacLin has received numerous awards across his career, recognizing his excellence in teaching and research, including: the Outstanding Graduate Student Award~University of Central Oklahoma, Outstanding Teaching Award~Graduate School, UNR (1996 & 1997), Regents' Scholar Award~Nevada Board of Regents (1999), the State of Nevada Board of Regents' Outstanding Graduate Student Award (1999), Senatorial and Congressional recognition (1999), Mentoring Award~UNI McNair Scholars (2003), UNI Distinguished Scholar Award (2008), Others.
