The department has not admitted anyone to these two emphases for several years. The only students still declared with either of these emphases would be at the stage of needing to complete the thesis, not to take any more courses.

Clinical Mental Health Counseling; School Psychology this reflects automatic drop of courses PSYCH 6301 6302 6303 6304 6305 which have not been offered in 4 years.

The changes integrate all of the scientist-practitioner content into a repeated practicum course. This should facilitate student understanding of practical issues in clinical psychology. this reflects automatic drop of courses PSYCH 6301 6302 6303 6304 6305 which have not been offered in 4 years. Change to clinical science program drops 6408 External Clinical Practicum and replaces it with two courses 6416 and 6417 External Clinical Practicum I & II. Change awards course credit for when students actually complete the practicum hours.

These courses were contained in the Industrial-Organization Emphasis and Industrial-Organization 5th year emphasis, and these 2 emphases also are being dropped at the department's request rather than designate replacement courses. The department has not admitted anyone to these two emphases for several years. The only students still declared with either of these emphases would be at the stage of needing to complete the thesis, not to take any more courses. Change to clinical science program drops 6408 External Clinical Practicum and replaces it with two courses 6416 and 6417 External Clinical Practicum I & II.
