Furthermore, our state faces a labor shortage that is worsening, and a brain drain that threatens our viability. Numerous policies at the state and local levels are being enacted to combat this problem and draw new people into the workforce. Because so many UNI students stay here and enter Iowa's workforce after graduation, removing people from campus is removing people from Iowa's workforce. As our campus community aspires to grow even further in size and to nurture the lives and minds of Iowa's future workforce, international students represent a substantial portion of our growth. We welcome you here because we are enriched by your presence and because we need you, both in Iowa and here at UNI.

We, the Faculty of UNI, love and value our students, whether you come to us from countries near or far. We dedicate our lives to this career because being around you brings us joy and gives us hope. Whether you come from Canada or Cameroon, Mexico or Mali, we welcome you, we celebrate your presence with us, and we will do everything in our power to support and protect you and your rights.
