Mrs. Vallentine holds two BM degrees, one in Music Theory and Composition and one in Music Education, from Southeast Missouri State University, and an MM in Music Theory from the University of Kentucky. She has taught at the University of Northern Iowa as an adjunct music instructor (now Assistant Adjunct Professor) since 1992. During that time, she taught a wide variety of courses in music theory, aural training, sight singing, introduction to music theory, music appreciation, and applied saxophone.
